This correlation of *Alive in Christ*, to the Archdiocese of Seattle Religion Curriculum Guidelines, Grades 7-8 provides page references from only the *Student Editions*, grades 7 & 8. Other program components offer additional opportunities for instruction and development of the guidelines. The *Teacher Editions* include optional activities, scripture background, connections for liturgy links, and lectionary links and justice and peace.

Take Out: Family Faith on the Go, a monthly Family magazine, offers practical family touch points, Catholic conversation starters, family faith-builders with prayers, saints and the Sunday readings and positive reinforcement for deepening Catholic identity in the home. The *Alive in Christ* website (aliveinchrist.osv.com) provides additional class and family activities for the young person as well as a faith glossary; faith-sharing questions based on the Sunday cycle of readings; and supplemental instructional resources for the catechist or teacher to help implement word, worship, and service in the classroom.

Unique to *Alive in Christ* Grade 7 & 8 and cited in the correlation are such features as:

- **“Go to the Source”** challenges the adolescent to go directly to Scripture and find out more about the passage.
- **“In Summary: Catholics Believe”** reiterates lesson objectives and key concepts presented in the chapter.
- **“Where It Happened”** explores the places where biblical or Church events took place and where the Saints lived and grew in holiness.
- **“Catholic Faith Words”** define core Catholic teachings and help the students know and articulate the teaching of the Church in precise theological language.
- **“Catholics Today”** introduces young people to customs, practices, and devotions of our Church as experienced and celebrated throughout the world.
- **“The Church History Timeline”** presents key people, places, and events in the Church’s growth and development, along with secular events that affected the course of Church history and the life and work of Catholics around the world.
- **“Live Your Faith Component”** develops the seven principles of Catholic Social teaching and is correlated to both seasonal and core chapters.
- The **“Our Catholic Tradition”** reference section presents information on our Creeds, Sacraments, prayers, and practices of our Catholic faith.

1. First Seven Ecumenical Councils (see grade 7 Church History Timeline)

- 1) First Council of Nicaea, 325, Trinity, Nicene Creed
- 2) First Council of Constantinople, 381, current form of Nicene Creed
- 3) First Council of Ephesus, 431, Mary, Mother of God
- 4) Council of Chalcedon, 451, the two natures of Christ, human and divine
- 5) Second Council of Constantinople, 553, various heresies resolved
- 6) Third Council of Constantinople, 680, Jesus, human and divine, has two wills; his human will is subject to his divine will.
- 7) Second Council of Nicaea, 787, icons allowed

Task 5: Church History (*Expansion of periods of Church history marked Church History Timeline can be found in on-line lesson planner*)

Religious Orders through the ages: (some definitions are from the CCC)

- 1) Hermits: A hermit is one who lives the eremitical life. Through silence and solitude, in prayer and penance, the hermit or anchorite vows, although not necessarily publically, to follow the evangelical counsels out of love for God and desire for the salvation of the world.
- 2) Monks: male monastics; see 3) below.
- 3) Monastics: Consecrated men and women whose lives are marked by the public profession of religious vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience, and by a stable community life (in a monastery) with the celebration of the Liturgy of the Hours in choir.
- 4) Mendicants: Originally these were “begging” communities, dependent on donations, especially religious communities founded by Saints Francis and Dominic in the thirteenth centuries. Franciscans and Dominicans are still known as mendicant orders.
- 5) Missionaries: Religious men and women, along with lay people, who take the message of Christ to less Christian areas within their country or to other countries; Works of charity (medical, educational, economic, etc.) often are part of the work of missionaries.

TASK 5: Church Faithful

Explain the function of Papal **Encyclicals**, Pastoral Letters and the Catholic Catechism as vehicles for the unity of the Church.

- 1) Papal **Encyclicals**—pastoral letters written by Popes and sent to the whole world, to express Church teaching on some important matter. Encyclicals are expressions of the ordinary papal Magisterium.
- 2) Pastoral Letters—letters signed by the Pope and addressed to the bishops of the Church or to the whole Church, sometimes written after a synod or other important meeting; lower in authority than encyclicals and apostolic exhortations.
- 3) *Catechism of the Catholic Church*—the compiled teachings of the Catholic Church organized into four parts: Part One: The Profession of Faith (Creed), Part Two: The Celebration of the Christian Mystery (Sacraments, sacramentals, funerals), Part Three: Life in Christ (Morality), Part Four: Christian Prayer.
