



TRANSITION Forming Disciples and Misunderstanding Along the Way

- Healing of a blind man in two stages
- Peter proclaims Jesus as "the Christ"
- Jesus teaches that the messiah must "suffer greatly" and predicts his Passion for the first time
- Peter protests and Jesus rebukes him and insists:
 "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself" (8:34)

Further Predictions of the Passion

- Prediction of the Passion #2 (9:30-32)
 and the need to become like children
- Prediction of the Passion #3 (10:32-34)
 and the ambition of James and John
- A second healing of a blind man as
 Jesus passes through Jericho and heads
 for Jerusalem.

Challenges to Discipleship

From Mark:

- From without (the Pharisees, Scribes, Herod, "Jerusalem" = the "establishment"): "Lifestyles" of self-promotion and exploitation vs self giving
- From within (careerism): The need to learn and to achieve authentic motivation as a disciple through "downward mobility" and service along "the Way"

Challenges to Discipleship

From Pope Francis (<u>Evangelii Gaudium</u>):

From <u>without</u>, a crisis of communal commitment/ lack of solidarity in society at large:

- i. A culture of greed and exclusion (#53)
- ii. A "crude and naïve trust in the goodness of those wielding economic power and in the "sacralized" workings of the prevailing economic system and, with it, a "globalization of indifference" (#54)
- iii. The idolatry of money (#55)
- iv. Ethics is marginalized because it opposes mere power and greed (#57)

From <u>within</u>: "Careerism" that seeks merely personal profit from a position within the church. Inauthentic motivation that leads to sloth and pessimism, analyzed in # 82.

PART TWO: JESUS IN JERUSALEM

Jerusalem:

- The locus of Roman occupational power
- The locus of Jewish leadership aligned with Rome
- The Temple, which, as Mark's congregation knew, was destined to fall in 70 AD.

Five Controversies with Opponents

- The parable of the tenants of the vineyard: A
 Key Parable in the church's early preaching
 (see Acts).
- "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's": No political order can require absolute obedience against the kingdom of God.

Five Controversies with Opponents

- From the story of the woman and the seven brothers ("Whose wife will she be?") the truth of the resurrection is shown to be contemplated even in the Torah.
- The great commandment of the Law, as Jesus also teaches, is Love of God and of neighbor.
- As Jesus interprets Psalm 110, Jesus is David's "Lord"








The Trial of Jesus and Denial of Peter
